

High School Reading Summer Work for 2023

Below are the requirements for your summer work. You will be responsible for reading one novel to be prepared for class when you return. If you have any questions, please contact Mrs. Najarro through email or Teams.

Incoming 9th and 10th graders

Read Fahrenheit 451 by Ray Bradbury.

It will be important that you read the entire book over the summer to prepare for the first day of class. Upon returning to school, you will be responsible for several assignments/projects in various classes. Your teacher will give you details about each of the following assignments on the first day of class.

English – You will be writing journals, answering questions, doing a project, and writing an essay.

History – You will have a project to complete over the novel.

Math – We will conduct a study over fire and temperature.

Theology and Science components will be announced at your first class.

Incoming 11th and 12th graders

Read Lincoln's Highway by Amor Towles.

**Note about Lincoln's Highway: the perspective of the story changes; there is not one narrator.*

It will be important that you read the entire book over the summer to prepare for the first day of class. Upon returning to school, you will be responsible for several assignments/projects in various classes. Your teacher will give you details about each of the following assignments on the first day of class.

English – You will be writing journals and an essay.

History – You will create a map of Lincoln's Highway.

Math – You will make calculations based on distance and speed that the characters traveled.
